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# NEWSLETTER ARWA 2021

The fifth annual conference of ARWA was held by Taiwan Normal University from March 5<sup>th</sup> to March 6<sup>th</sup> 2021. The two-day ARWA Annual Conference included 4 keynote speeches, 114 publishers, 62 oral presentations of papers, and 51 posters published on literacy research. The topics included cognitive and language development, digital reading, dyslexia, cross-cultural and multicultural issues, cognitive neuropsychology, etc. Over 150 scholars from 16 countries met online together and participated in this annual event. We thank Professor Li-Yu Hung and her team for organizing the conference during the COVID-19 period.

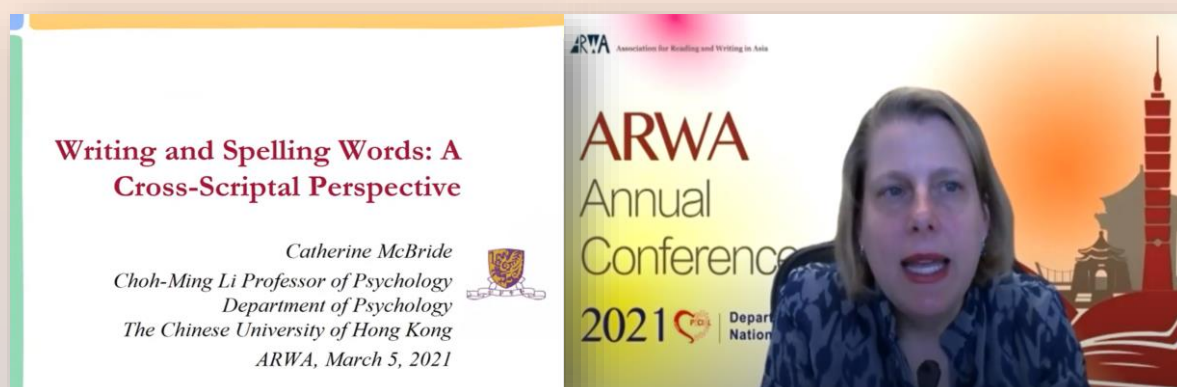

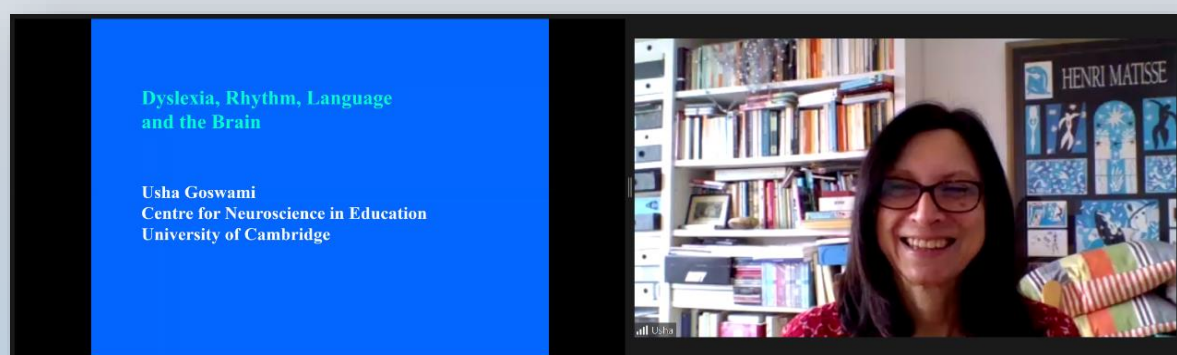


# Highlights from ARWA 2021 Conference

There were four keynote speeches during the conference. The first keynote speech was given by Professor Catherine A. McBride from Hong Kong. Professor McBride shared her research of early spelling development across languages. She pointed out the universal component of writing and spelling and the importance of the scaffolding and instruction to children's spelling and writing development.



The second keynote speech was given by Professor Usha Goswami from UK. By describing a neural oscillatory “temporal sampling” framework for linking amplitude rise time discrimination to linguistic development by children, Professor Goswami showed that the sensitivity to the amplitude modulation (AM) structure of infant-directed and child-directed speech is key to individual differences in phonological development, and that this AM structure contains acoustic statistical cues to different phonological units.



# Highlights from ARWA 2021 Conference

The third keynote speech was given by Professor Yuhtsuen Tzeng from Taiwan. Professor Tzeng's research focused on the relation between vocabulary, inference, and reading comprehension among fourth to sixth graders. The cross sectional and longitudinal data highlighted the importance of vocabulary depth according to its unique contribution to reading comprehension over and above vocabulary breadth and inference.

The last keynote speech was given by Professor Paavo H.T. Leppänen from Finland. He and his research team designed the instruction and assessment tools for teachers, and used eye-tracking system and neurocognitive measurement to examine the internet information seeking skills of 400 sixth graders including students with learning difficulties. The research pointed out that new reading skills and strategies are required for the contemporary readers.

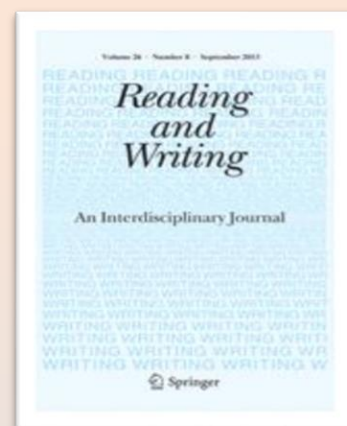

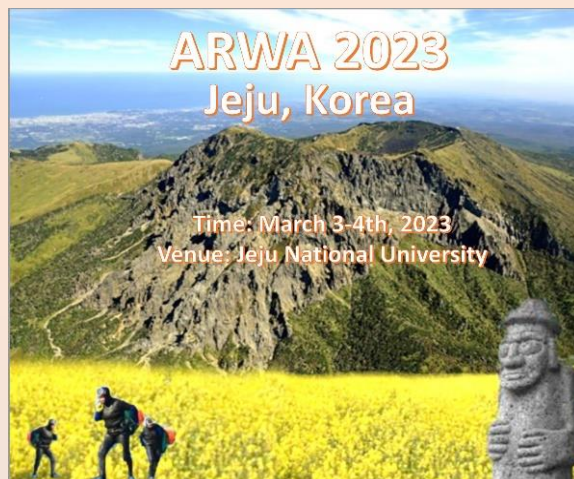
