A Brief History of ARWA

In 2013, honorary founder **Prof. Akira Uno**, with **Jeung-Ryeul Cho**, **Kevin Chung**, **Li-Yu Hung**, and **Taeko Wydell** as key contributors, initiated what became a series of regional symposia that served to connect researchers and graduate students who were interested in Asian languages and in learning and writing difficulties in these languages. These symposia took place in Seoul, Korea (2013), Tokyo, Japan (2014), Taipei, Taiwan (2015), and Seoul, Korea (2016). In the 2016 Korea meeting, researchers voted to form an association that hosted a full-fledged conference dedicated to reading and writing in Asia. In addition, the initial focus on Japanese, Korean, and Chinese languages was extended to cover the multiple languages and orthographies in Asia.

To date, **Association for Reading and Writing in Asia** has successfully hosted two annual conferences with around 100 attendees in each meeting. A third meeting is already scheduled for 2019. We are optimistic that we will continue to grow as a society and that many exciting developments are yet to occur in the coming years!

FIRST ANNUAL CONFERENCE


Hong Kong SAR, 2017








CALL FOR PAPERS
